<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Practise high frequency words and put them into sentences.</li><li>• Write a book review of your favourite fairy tale. Including Summary, response, recommendation.</li><li>• Compare two fairy tales writing a description of their similarities and differences.</li><li>• Write a summary of the book you are currently reading.</li><li>• Handwriting – practise letter formation</li><li>• Write and illustrate your own fairy-tale with a main character, villain and a problem to be resolved. Use lots of descriptive language to bring the story to life.</li><li>• Draw a comic strip of your favourite fairy-tale</li><li>• Write your own version of a traditional tale. It could be Cinderella,</li><li>• Write a poem about your favourite animal.</li><li>• Use the Literacyshed.com. Find a clip that you like and complete an activity</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Practise writing numbers 1 – 20 in words (Year 1).</li><li>• Practise writing numbers 1 – 100 in words (Year 2).</li><li>• Practise 2, 5, and 10 times tables.</li><li>• Revisiting 2D and 3D shapes – conduct a shape hunt and identify the shapes and their properties.</li><li>• Money – Create a coin rub of different coins and write down their values. Challenge: Put the coins in order of value from smallest to greatest.</li><li>• Money – set up a shop with items for sale. Which coins would you use to add up the exact value?</li><li>• Money – Giving change from 20p</li><li>• Practise number bonds to 20. Writing a part-part-whole diagram for each one. Challenge: Write the subtraction facts for each of them.</li><li>• Fractions – Draw different 2D shapes and then split some in half <math>\frac{1}{2}</math> and some in quarter <math>\frac{1}{4}</math>.</li><li>• Multiplication using counters (making ‘groups of’ and arranging in a grid)</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Draw a map of your route to school from your house. Challenge: add the street names on your map.</li><li>• Write a list of questions you would like to ask someone who lived in Hackney 100 years ago.</li><li>• Research a famous Hackney resident and write and illustrate a report about them.</li><li>• Use a local map to find all the places of worship in your neighbourhood. Are they all the same?
