How it works

Over this half term children need to choose a **minimum of 3** homework challenge tasks to complete and hand into school on **Monday 27th March**. If children want to complete more than this, then they are very welcome to do so.

We would encourage children to pick at least one task from each subject area but the choice is down to the individual child.

The homework challenge tasks have been designed to be practical and creative but please continue to use the red homework books to record what children have completed during the half term. This might be by writing about it, using computing skills, sticking in drawings or even photos. It would be really helpful if children could date their work.

Adults supporting homework challenge tasks are also free to write in homework books to confirm children have completed particular tasks if necessary.
