

YEAR 5 & 6 HACKNEY **MUSEUM SESSION**

On Monday the children in years 5 and 6 took part in a virtual workshop lesson offered by Hackney Museum. The session was based on our previous topic The Windrush. During the interactive session the children found out more about Windrush & the Windrush Generation's motivations for moving to Britain. They discussed the discrimination experienced by the Windrush Generation and considered their feelings about moving to a new home. The session ended with the children considering how they would feel about leaving their home and what they would find difficult.





LOCAL CHURCH VISIT

This week all of Year 1 and 2 went to visit St Michael and All Angels' Church in Hackney. The Vicar was called Daniel and he told us about the Church and how Christians celebrate Christmas there. We acted out the nativity story and even sung some Christmas carols. We enjoyed our visit and finding out more about our topic of Christianity.

As the days are colder, please ensure your child brings in the appropriate warm clothes to wear over their PE kit (tracksuit top and bottoms). Thank you.




END OF TERM EXTENDED DAY & CLUBS
