### KINGSMEAD IS **OUTSTANDING!**

We are delighted to be able to write to you about the amazing outcome for

Kingsmead in its recent OFSTED inspection. Kingsmead was first judged to be outstanding in 2011 some 13 years ago now, but OFSTED has changed a good deal in the meantime and it has become much harder to achieve an outstanding grade.

Kingsmead didn't stand still after its 2011 inspection but went on to be designated as National Teaching School and Louise Nichols, as the then headteacher of Kingsmead, became an National Leader of Education. In 2012 Louise became Executive Headteacher of Gayhurst as well. In 2014 we formed the LEAP Federation so that we could work together with other schools collaboratively and in 2015 Mandeville joined us to complete the group of schools that LEAP is today. The unique focus of LEAP schools has always been the Arts (the A in LEAP) and delivering our curriculum through visual and performing arts where possible, for example Kingsmead is a Platinum Artsmark school, the highest accolade a school can be awarded by the Arts council. In 2019 we started our complete rework of the curriculum to produce what is now known as the 'Empowerment curriculum' which is Rich, Representative and Relevant and a bespoke curriculum delivered only in our schools. Three separate OFSTED teams in the last two years have now recognised that our curriculum is exemplary and that each of our schools is child centred and aims to develop the whole child and care about the wellbeing of every child and member of staff.

It is always difficult to maintain an 'exemplary in all areas' OFSTED judgement and with all credit to the Kingsmead team, that is exactly what they did. A few highlights from the report that can be read here are:

'This is a school where everyone is treated fairly and equally. Pupils' best interests are at the heart of all the school's work.' 'Pupils are exceptionally well behaved and show kindness and respect for their fellow pupils and school staff. The school provides many engaging activities to spark pupils' interests and nurture their talents.'

A huge congratulations to Evelyn, Kingsmead's headteacher, and the whole school team including our hard working LEAP governors for this amazing result. We are sure you will join everyone at Kingsmead and in the federation, in celebrating this amazing outcome.

### PARENT GOVERNOR **ELECTION GOES LIVE**

Today every parent who is registered as the primary carer for their family at a LEAP school should have received an email inviting them to vote in the election.

In cases where there are two or more parents registered, we have also sent votes. As we said last week if you are a parent/carer of a child at one of our schools you are entitled to vote so if you have not received a vote please email your school admin office

We have two parent governor posts to fill so each parent needs to choose the TWO candidates they would like to see as Parent Governors and vote for them, regardless of the number of children you have in the school.

If you are not able to vote electronically you can ask the office to print you a copy and vote on paper but where possible we ask parents to vote electronically, if at all possible, as it keeps the process simple, fair and transparent. The voting system counts the votes and lets us know the outcome on the final day. Paper votes will be counted by the headteacher in each school and added to the electronic votes.

The voting starts today, Friday 26th January and finishes at 5pm on Monday 19th February. There are 8 candidates across the three schools and again, as we said last week, please choose candidates on their statements not on whether they are a parent at your child's school.

The two candidates with the most votes will be elected to the LEAP governing body.

We really want to thank the candidates for putting themselves forward for this very important role and are happy to answer any queries by any parent on the process.



# SCHOOL COUNCIL VISIT PARLIAMENT

On Wednesday, our school council visited the Houses of Parliament. They had a tour of the building and took part in a laws and debating workshop. In this workshop our school councillors learnt about how laws are made by following the journey of a bill through the House of Commons and the House of Lords, before it becomes a law. They saw the House of Lords, and some of the current bills that will be debated in the House of Commons – laws concerning data protection and automated cars. They saw where the King sits whenever he visits the House of Lords, it is also known as the

'Sovereign's Throne' and this is where the King's Speech takes place. They also saw where the opposition sits and where the Lord speaker sits when there is a debate. They learnt about the importance of the Magna Carta, a document that states that the King and its government are not above the law.








Trace the Lazy 8 with your finger starting at the star & taking a deep breath in.
