#### MANDEVILLE OFSTED



Mandeville had a graded OFSTED inspection on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. This was the follow up inspection after OFSTED said in September 2022 that 'there is enough evidence of improved performance to

suggest that the school could be judged outstanding' Four inspectors were with the school for two full days and looked into all aspects of school life from nursery to year 6, visiting lessons, playtimes, support for SEND, lunch provision and extended day. They looked at children's learning in great detail including a selection of children's work books and analysed our curriculum in great detail to look for exemplary practice in all areas. They met with parents in the playground, the local authority school improvement partner and our governors. Very importantly they held several meetings with children of all ages to ask them about their school.

They then decided grades for each of those areas. At present the outcome is confidential, as the inspectors judgements now have to go through a quality control process. The full report and outcome will be published in around 4-6 weeks.

A huge thank you to the amazing effort by Mandeville staff children, parents, the Gayhurst & Kingsmead staff, our community and all our school governors.

We are pleased about how it went and look forward to sharing the outcome with you as soon as we are allowed to.
