English

In English, we will start the term with the book **Street Child** by Berlie Doherty. The book is set in Victorian London and is based on the true story of Jim Jarvis. Our writing around this novel will include character descriptions, diary writing, playscripts and writing formal and informal letters. Later in the term, we will be reading the book, **Pig Heart Boy**, by Malorie Blackman. The story is based on a 13 year old boy who needs a heart transplant and his family is approached by a pioneering doctor with a startling proposal. The children will be taking part in debates where they will be expected to justify their views as well being able to distinguish between statements of facts and opinions. Our grammar and punctuation work will include using commas to clarify meaning and brackets to indicate parenthesis. We will also be learning about adverbs to indicate degrees of possibility, modal verbs and using various devices to build cohesion in paragraphs.

Reading

Children are expected to read at home every night and discuss what they have read with an adult. It is essential that your child fully understands the text they are reading and become familiar with new vocabulary. Reading helps to develop their understanding of different stories, text types and helps to instil a love of reading. A skill that is vital for children to progress across the whole curriculum.

Maths

In Maths next term we will consolidate our work on decimals. We will also be learning about shapes and their properties, this will include relating 3D shapes to their 2D nets and extending our understanding of angles. Later on in the term we will learn about position and direction, symmetry, co-ordinates and translation of shapes. We will end the term by converting units of measure and understanding the difference between capacity and volume.

You can help your child at home by: Encouraging them to learn and remember all of their times table and division facts, out of sequence and ensuring that they complete their Maths homework each week. If your child needs help with their homework, please ask them to come and speak to me anytime before Tuesday.

PE

This half term we will be doing P.E on Thursdays and Drumming and Drumming and dance on a Friday.

Foundation Subjects

Our Science topics for this half term will be Living Things and their Habitat followed by Animals Including Humans. In Geography, our focus of study will be the Geography of the UK. We will continue to teach Art, Spanish, Music and PSHCE on a weekly basis.
