Mandeville received their official OFSTED report this week and we're delighted to be able to share with you that they were graded Outstanding in all areas. We are very proud that in the last year all three LEAP schools Gayhurst, Kingsmead and now Mandeville have been graded as Outstanding by OFSTED. We

hope that speaks to the strength of the federation in working together as a group of Local Authority maintained schools. As a federation we have built our team to work together and achieved economies of scale both financially and in terms of workload for our staff. Headteachers work very closely together under the overall leadership of our Executive Headteacher and in this way all challenges and opportunities can be shared and the pressures on individuals reduced. For children this means a wider understanding of the borough they live in and a chance to regularly partner with children at other schools. It also means access to specialist teachers & wellbeing provision that could not be afforded by one school alone but can be shared across the federation.

HACKNEY RE CALENDAR COMPETITION

The annual Hackney RE calendar competition has commenced for 2024-25. Last year, LEAP schools made up almost half of the calendar illustrations (5 winners). It would be great to have more winners from LEAP this year. All the artwork is selected through a boroughwide poster competition, which is open to all pupils across from Year 1 upwards in Hackney Schools. This year's Religion and Worldviews competition theme is on 'Unity' and aims to celebrate diversity & unity within the Hackney community. It also supports Hackney's 'No Place for Hate' campaign.

- On A4 landscape, preferably on coloured paper and/ or using strong/bold colours - i.e. felt pens or paints, rather than pale pencils
- · labelled clearly with pupils' names, school and year group must be clear on the back- not the front
- · Preferably have no writing on the poster (labels, titles, names etc.)
- If entries do contain some text, please check words have the correct spelling before submission

NEW HOARDING MURAL

As many of you will have already seen we have a wonderful new bluebell mural on the hoarding which is up at Gayhurst, created by Claire from ArtHoppers. The theme was developed in consultation with Lidka, our school gardener and aims to promote the beauty and fragility of the flowers planted in the raised beds around the school grounds. A series of 3 wooden stools at the entrance of the school evoke a woodland feel in which the bluebell scene has been painted. The broader aims of the murals messaging is to encourage children to care for the flowers and help them to flourish.

A blackboard panel framed with painted botanical elements invites children to chalk in their own ideas of what lives and grows in their secret garden.

Claire will be working with Reception and Year 1 and Year 2 children in the coming weeks on their Life cycles & Science topic: Plants, which will allow them a great

opportunity to further expand on the idea of caring for nature. Watch this space for more news on what they get up to soon.....












YEAR 1 VISIT HACKNEY SCHOOL OF FOOD
